

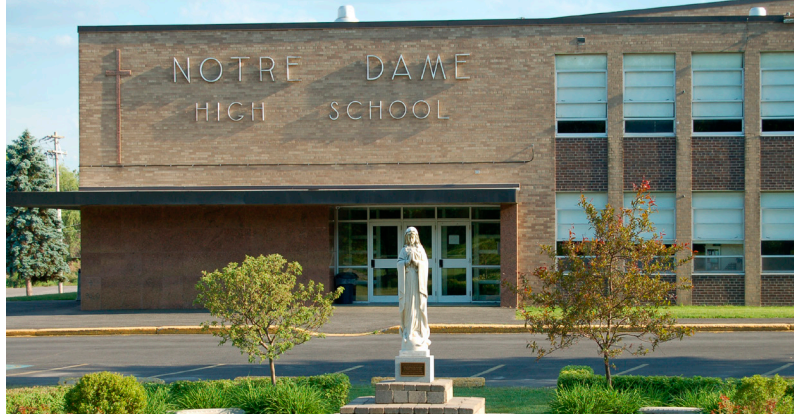

NOTRE DAME ALUMNI OFFER REAL LIFE CAREER ADVICE TO STUDENTS

As part of our mission to make students World Ready, the school counseling office branched out with several opportunities to offer Notre Dame students a glimpse in to various career opportunities over the course of the school year.

A career day was held in the early spring with many Notre Dame alumni, parents, and friends of Notre Dame presenting real world career advice to the sophomore, junior, and senior classes. Career day serves as a way to help our students relate the courses they are taking now to their future careers. The event also helps students learn more about potential career interests, while allowing them to meet and develop connections with our alumni and others in the ND family. Students were asked to select career presentations from a list of available topics. The career day speakers represented a variety of careers including: law, medicine, veterinary science, marketing, entrepreneurship, and finance. "Having alumni and friends return to our school to share their experiences since graduation with our current students is a perfect circle of inspiration that we're sure will leave an impression upon our students and help guide them in their future career paths," said school Principal Ronald Spadafora.

The event was organized by Ms. Erika Kistowski, school counselor. "the value in this [program] is huge. Students might come back with a comment such as "I can truly see myself doing this!" or "Well Ms. Kistowski, I know I definitely do NOT want to be an engineer."

MARIAN CLUB SEEKS TO EXPAND MEMBERSHIP

The Marian Club was founded in 1991 by UCA, St. Francis and ND alumni, as well as parents and friends of Catholic education in the Utica area. It was formed for the sole purpose of providing tuition assistance to students who might not otherwise be able to attend Notre Dame. Since 1991, over \$500,000 in scholarship aid has been given to Notre Dame Jr/Sr High School students. During the previous school year, \$15,000 was awarded by the Marian Club to students who had financial need. The Club relies on membership dues as well as the memorial brick project to fund our yearly scholarships. Current membership dues are \$100 per year and 100% of the membership dues and brick sales goes directly to the annual scholarship fund. The Marian Club Brick Memorial to Our Lady of Notre Dame is located directly in front of Notre Dame Junior-Senior High School. Bricks may be purchased for \$100 per brick. The bricks can memorialize one or more individuals, a special event (Sports team, NJROTC, etc.), or be inscribed with a message to the school or classmates. Each brick can accommodate up to three lines of 18 characters per line with spaces counting as characters.

2019 DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS

Bruce Karam, ND '79

The Distinguished Alumni Award is bestowed upon an individual alumnus from Notre Dame, St. Francis de Sales, or Utica Catholic Academy each year at graduation. The Award honors alumni who have typified the Notre Dame tradition of excellence and brought credit to the school by their personal accomplishment, professional achievement, or humanitarian service.

This year's award was presented to Bruce Karam, Class of 1979. Karam currently serves as Superintendent of the Utica City School District. As a lifelong resident of the City of Utica,

New York he had a desire to serve the youth of our community and obtained a Master's Degree in Education from the College of St. Rose. His love of teaching and the enjoyment that he received from working with students led him to pursue a Certificate of Advanced Study (CAS) in Educational Administration from the State University of New York at Cortland.

Karam cites being Principal of John F. Kennedy Middle School as part of the most rewarding experiences of his professional career. During this time, Mr. Karam has received numerous awards and honors. In 2003, he earned the United States Department of Education No Child Left Behind National Blue Ribbon Award; the United States Congressional Certificate of Special Recognition and Achievement; the New York State Assembly Certificate of Special Recognition for High Achievement; and the State University of New York Institute of Technology Alumni Humanitarian of the Year Award. In 2006, Mr. Karam earned the New York State Middle School Principal of the Year Award.

Mr. Karam has proudly served the Utica City School District and our children for over 25 years including 21 years as an administrator. In addition to his many degrees, Mr. Karam was also honored five consecutive years; from 1999-2003 by the New York State School Boards Association and the Business Council of New York State for fostering high achievement and outstanding educational improvement at John F. Kennedy Middle School.

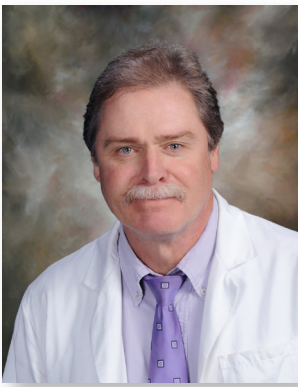

To continue to engage students in the sciences, Notre Dame hired nationally recognized and 2017 Yale Educator of the Year physics teacher, Dwight "Buzz" Putnam. Putnam's classroom was a favorite amongst juniors and seniors where student-led group work, project-based learning, and hands-on labs all combined to provide a 21st century education. The much admired and inspirational teacher, who is a member of the Cornell University Institute for Physics Teachers Lab Development Team, increased the mastery rate of the students taking the Physics Regents by 28%.

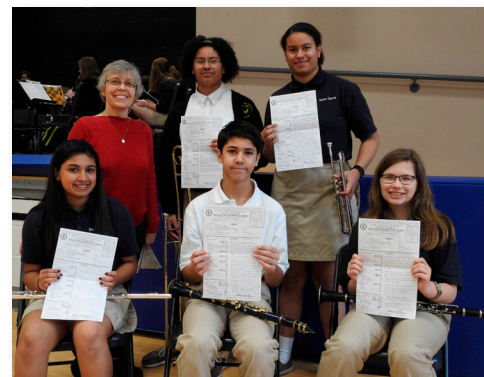
PROLIFE BABY SHOWER

NJROTC NATIONALS



Being one of the oldest units in the Northeast, the Notre Dame NJROTC program has gained annual national exposure for excellence and exceptional effectiveness. This is underscored by the receipt of annual honors and designations to include three consecutive designations as "Distinguished Unit with Honors" (2017, 2018, and 2019). Students made their second trip this year to the Nationals and were ranked the 25th best unit in the world in Academics, Athletics and Drill. The cadets also earned the coveted "Captain James Harvey

Award." This award was established in honor of Captain James H. Harvey, a Naval Aviator, who is credited with generating NJROTC competitions, and today are national in scope. Teamwork, leadership, athletic ability and academic achievement are all tested in such competitions and are the very attributes on which he built his life and career. This national award recognizes the NJROTC unit that displays the highest degree of military decorum, personal conduct, and spirit throughout the entire competition.

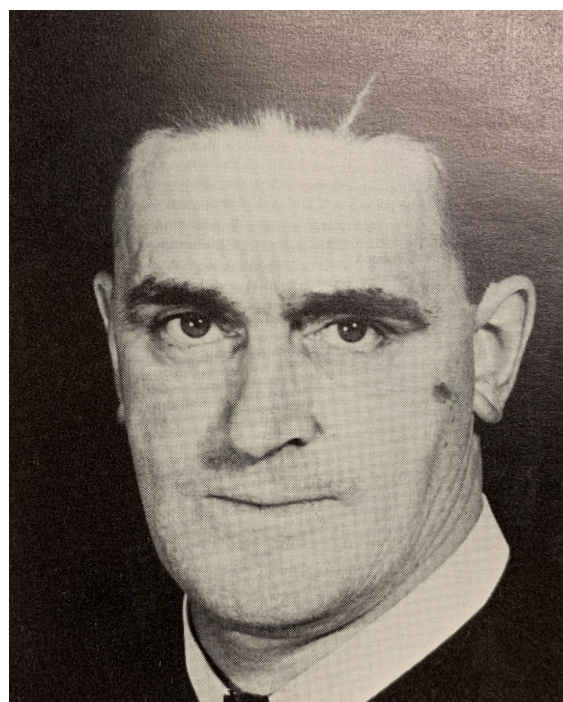
NOTRE DAME ANNOUNCES XAVERIAN BROTHERS LEGACY SOCIETY

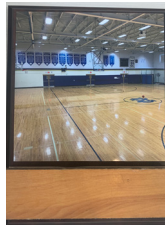

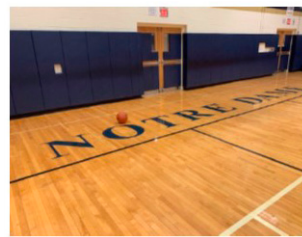

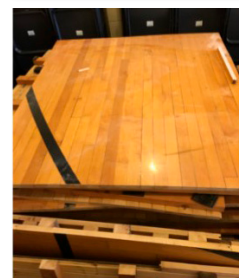
